#### **MINUTES**

Board of Directors August 17, 2021

### SUBJECT TO APPROVAL

1. The meeting was called to order with proper social distancing among everyone and with accommodation for the public through the use of Zoom Meetings at 9:00 A.M. Board Secretary Pete Neal called the meeting to order and the Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

### 2. Public Appearances/Comment - None

### 3. Consent Items

Mr. McKinney made a motion to approve the Consent Items. Mr. Dashner seconded; motion passed 4-0 (AYES: Barr, Dashner, McKinney, Neal; ABSENT: Clemens).

### 4. COMMITTEE REPORTS

### 4.1. Finance Committee (Directors Dashner & Barr)

Chief Johnson reported the District was still at year end and year beginning with the Auditor's Office having not yet applied the carryover yet to the new fiscal year. He added that having added the \$3.4 million estimated carryover to the revenues and expenditures at the begging of the year, he estimated \$2.4 million for starting as District reserves. He reported that there were big payroll runs with the engine being deployed to area wildland fires. He reported that the committee would be meeting to finalize the FY 2021-22 budget

so that it could be published and readied for Board adoption at the September Board meeting. He also noted that there had been a good month of transport revenue in July.

### 4.2. Personnel Committee (Directors Dashner & McKinney)

Chief Johnson reported there had been more updates with COVID-19 with adaptations to make the District's plan as contemporary as possible and personnel were now required to wear masks for indoor errands in the community as our County was in a high transmission rate.

### 4.3. Fire Prevention Committee (Directors Clemens & Neal)

Chief Johnson reported that the committee members had reviewed the current active projects in the District including the ongoing Cruzer's remodel. Discussion regarding introduction of a possibility of burn ban continues and the committee will refine the idea with due diligence.

4.4. <u>Apparatus/Equipment Committee (Directors McKinney & Neal)</u>
No report.

### 5. Scheduled Items

- 5.1. CalPERS: Fiscal Year 2021-22 Unfunded Accrued Liability Paid in Full
  Chief Johnson reported that three letters had been received following the District's
  payment of its annual amount set for the fiscal year among its separate CalPERS
  rate plans—Misc. Classic, Safety Classic, and Safety PEPRA.
- 5.2. CA EMSA Health Care Workers Vaccine Requirements State Public Health Order Chief Johnson reported this was very fluid right now and does not include firefighters at this time. He noted that 80% of the District's personnel were vaccinated. He reported there would be more information to follow as the District moved forward trying to make the best decision.
- 5.3. <u>Calaveras Enterprise Article: Rural Fire Districts Losing Firefighters</u>
  Chief Johnson reported the article reported somewhat accurately the ongoing issue of area firefighters becoming trained by fire districts only to lose them to State and Federal ramped up hiring processes and higher pay schedules.
- 5.4. Calaveras County Registrar of Voters: Notice of Intent to

  <u>Circulate a Petition to Enact the Calaveras Local Fire Protection Tax</u>

  Chief Johnson reported the movement to enact a Calaveras County fire protection tax had moved from the Calaveras County Fire JPA to a citizen's initiative group which had taken on the building and finalization of the proposal for the County voters.

### 5.5. Thank-you Letter from Cheri and Tim Mann

The Board noted the thank-you and Chief Johnson commented that the success of this agency has little to do with the decisions made by the Board but through the culmination of the good calls and excellent service provided by the line staff.

### 5.6. Create an Ad Hoc Committee or Designate Established Committee

to Negotiate Local 3581 Memorandum of Understanding

Chief Johnson reported the current MOU was expiring in June 2022 and the Local was wanting to start discussions regarding it. After some discussion, the Board's consensus was to have the Personnel Committee do the negotiation.

### 6. REPORTS

### 6.1. Administrative Report

Chief Johnson reported the Calaveras Fire JPA was currently working on a County-wide water tender replacement plan.

### 6.2. <u>Legislative Report</u>

Chief Johnson noted that there was not much to report other than the recall ballots beginning to arrive in the mail.

### 6.3. Administrative - EMS

Chief Johnson reported there has been a big call volume with nearly 60,000 miles on the 2018 ambulance and 30,000 miles on the 2020 ambulance. He also reported that Stanislaus County had officially removed themselves the Mountain-Valley EMS Agency which may mean other configurations for that particular agency.

### 7. COMMENTS, QUESTIONS, CONSIDERATIONS

### 7.1. Board Members

Mr. Dashner thanked the firefighting staff for their continued efforts providing excellent service for the community.

Mr. Neal noted his discouragement on the vaccination percentage within the District staff and expressed that the vaccination was important to him personally.

7.2. <u>Firefighters Association</u> – Jim Eaves thanked the Board members for their active involvement in the District especially as they were unpaid with many meetings to attend.

Chief Johnson reported that the Alisa Ann Ruch Foundation children had been able to come to the area and Matt O'Donnell reported that they had experienced a good day at Lake Alpine/Bear Valley area and enjoyed much food.

7.3. Employees' Group – Chief Johnson reported that the 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary for 9-1-1 was around the corner and he had authorized the purchase and wearing of 9-1-1 Commemorative Uniform T-shirts for 30 days ahead and beyond the 9/11 date for this year and next year.

### NOTICE OF MODIFICATIONS TO TEXT OF PROPOSED REGULATIONS

Ebbetts Pass Fire District

Please take notice that the California Public Employees' Retirement System is proposing changes to the regulations that are the subject of this rulemaking action. The California Public Employees' Retirement System is proposing amendments to the proposed regulation text.

Pursuant to the requirements of Government Code section 11346.8(c), and section 44 of Title 1 of the California Code of Regulations, the California Public Employees' Retirement System is providing notice of additional proposed changes to sections 599.500 and 599.508 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations covering the Public Employees' Medical and Hospital Care Act. These further changes are attached and made in response to comments received from the Office of Administrative Law regarding the proposed regulations received after the 45-day public comment period that ended February 15, 2021. The initial public notice was published by the Office of Administrative Law in Notice Register 2021, number 1-Z, entitled as "Public Employees Retirement System Risk Adjustment for Health Premiums" (Notice File Number Z2020-1221-02).

California Public Employees' Retirement System has made the following changes to the proposed regulation:

- Deleted language in section 599.500(a)(8)(A) requiring that the risk assessment method selected by California Public Employees' Retirement System be consistent with industry best practices and reinserted the original regulatory language that the risk adjustment methodology selected by California Public Employees' Retirement System be consistent with industry best practices and similar to risk adjustment methodologies used by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and other state and federal agencies. The reinsertion is now in section 599.508(a)(8).
- Reinserted in section 599.508(a)(8) the original regulatory language requiring California Public Employees' Retirement System to provide health benefit plans its risk adjustment methodology at least 90 days prior to the public announcement of the following year health benefit plan premiums.
- Deleted the provision in section 599.508(a)(8)(B) permitting the California Public Employees' Retirement System Board to exclude certain health benefit plans from having their premiums risk adjusted.
- Clarified and added criteria to the provision in section 599.508(a)(8)(C) permitting the Board to phase-in a risk adjustment calculation to all or specific health benefit plans over a period as determined by the Board. Due to other deletions, this revised provision is now in section 599.508(a)(8)(B).

 Specified in section 599.508(a)(8)(D) that risk adjustment does not apply to California Public Employees' Retirement System Medicare health benefit plans. Due to other deletions, this revised provision is now in section 599.508(a)(8)(C).

Text proposed to be added for this 15-day comment period is displayed in double underline type. Text proposed to be deleted for this 15-day comment period is displayed in double strikethrough type. In some instances, the text currently under consideration may be both single stricken and double underlined, which means it is text that was previously proposed to be deleted from an existing regulation, which the California Public Employees' Retirement System has restored and is no longer proposing to delete. Similarly, text that is both single underlined and double stricken means that the text was previously proposed to be added, but the California Public Employees' Retirement System subsequently decided to remove it.

The amended proposed regulation text is enclosed with this notice, along with an addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons, and is available for public inspection during the dates of the public comment period, described below, excluding weekend and holidays, from 8:00 a.m. through 5:00 p.m. The rulemaking file is maintained at the following address:

# REVISED TEXT OF PROPOSED REGULATORY ACTION BY CALPERS Amend §§ 599.500 and 599.508 Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR)

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.500, subdivision (x)

(x) "Risk adjustment" means an actuarial tool used to calibrate premiums paid to health benefits plans or carriers based on geographical differences in the cost of health care and the relative differences in the health risk characteristics of employees, annuitants, and family members enrolled in each plan. Risk adjustment establishes premiums, in part, by assuming an equal distribution of health risk among health benefits plans in order to avoid penalizing employees, annuitants, and family members for enrolling in a health benefits plan with higher than average health risk characteristics.

"Risk adjustment" means the process by which relative risk factors are assigned to individuals or groups based on expected resource use and by which those factors are taken into consideration and applied.

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)

- (8) Subject to the Board's authority to risk adjust premiums, and upon its approval to exercise this authority, participate in the following risk adjustment procedures.
- (8) Subject to the Board's authority to risk adjust health benefit plan premiums, and upon its approval to exercise this authority, participate in the risk adjustment methodology approved by the system. The system will select a risk adjustment methodology that is consistent with industry best practices and similar to those used by the United States Department of Health and Human Services and other state and federal agencies. The methodology will be provided at least 90 days prior to the public announcement of premiums for the next plan year.

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(A)

- (A) The annual premiums adopted by the Board for the next plan year will be risk adjusted utilizing the risk assessment method selected by the system. The system will select a risk adjustment methodology that is consistent with industry best practices and similar to those used by the United States Department of Health and Human Services and other state and federal agencies. The methodology will be provided to plans at least 90 days prior to the public announcement of premiums for the next plan year.
- (A) The annual health benefit plan premiums adopted by the Board for each plan year may be risk adjusted utilizing the risk assessment method selected by the system. The system will select a risk assessment method that is consistent with industry best practices.

### Proposed Amendment Deletion to of CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(B)

(B) The risk adjusted premiums adopted by the Board for the next plan year shall be subject to a calculation prior to the beginning of the plan year. This calculation may result in requiring a plan to reimburse the system or the system to reimburse a plan a portion of the monthly premiums on a monthly basis starting the beginning of the plan year. Reimbursements from plans to the system shall be deposited into an account established for this purpose pursuant to Section 22911 of the Government Code, within thirty days of receipt. Reimbursements from the system to plans shall be paid from the funds received from plans deposited into the aforementioned account, within thirty days of deposit.

(B) The Board may exclude specific health benefit plans from the risk adjustment methodology.

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(C)

- (C) During the plan year, a plan's enrollment and risk scores of employees, annuitants, and family members will be measured by the system to see if its risk adjusted premium needs to be re-calculated. This re-calculation may result in the medification of monthly reimbursement amounts, as outlined in (B) above, for the remainder of the plan year. Reimbursements from plans to the system shall be deposited into an account established for this purpose pursuant to Section 22911 of the Government Code, within thirty days of receipt from plans. Reimbursements from the system to plans shall be paid from the funds received from plans deposited into the aforementioned account, within thirty days of deposit.
- (C) For health-benefit plans subject to risk adjustment, the Board may apply a risk adjustment calculation to all health-benefit plans or specific health-benefit plans over a period as determined by the Board.
- (B) Upon implementation of a risk adjustment methodology, the Board may phase in its resulting health benefit plan premium adjustments for up to three years if the adjustments result in at least one individual plan premium increase or decrease of at least ten percent.

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(D)

- (D) A final reconciliation will be performed in the subsequent plan year and may result in additional reimbursements. Any additional reimbursements shall follow the reimbursement process outlined in paragraphs (B) and (C).
- (D) This paragraph shall not apply to an employee association health benefit plan subject to Board approval pursuant to Section 22850 of the Government Code.
- (C) This paragraph shall not apply to a Medicare health benefit plan, as defined in Section 22778 of the Government Code, or an employee association health benefit plan subject to Board approval pursuant to Section 22850 of the Government Code.

### Proposed Deletion of CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(E)

(E) This paragraph shall not apply to an employee association health benefit plan subject to Board approval pursuant to Section 22850 of the Government Code.

### Proposed Deletion of CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(9)

(9) Provide for payment to a special reserve, as of the end of any contract period, of so much of the contributions and other income attributable to the plan as exceeds the sum incurred for benefit payments, administrative expenses, premium and other taxes, risk charges, and other retention charges. Upon the request of the Board, made after a public hearing on the question, contribution rates must be reduced and/or benefits increased, whichever is appropriate in judgment of the Board, whenever the special reserve exceeds the latest three calendar months' contributions paid under the plan. In determining the amount of incurred benefits paid under the plan, reasonable reserves may be established for pending claims and incurred but unreported claims. All such claim reserves, and the special reserves, must be accounted for separately from reserves maintained by the carrier for other plans. Income derived from the investment of the special reserves shall be credited to the reserves at 100% of the plan's annual corporate rate of interest. Income reasonably attributable to investment of claim reserves shall be taken into account in determining the amount of retention charges. In the event the contract is terminated, the underwriting or obligation under the plan is assumed by a different carrier, or approval of the plan is withdrawn, the

special reserve and such portion of any claim reserves as are not finally utilized in the payment of benefits under the plan shall be paid into the Public Employees' Contingency Reserve Fund for the benefit of the plan, and the Board may then transfer such reserves to successor plans and/or carriers on such basis as it determines to be equitable after a public hearing held within 18 months following the offective date of the plan's termination, withdrawal of approval, or transfer to a different carrier. For a carrier providing service benefits, the board may approve the use of other equitable and practical financial procedures. For plans that are community rated, the carrier shall, in lieu of being subject to the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, agree to furnish such financial and accounting reports and to follow such recording procedures as may be requested by the Board and that are consistent with the normal operations of the plan.

Provide for payment to a special reserve of the contributions and other income attributable to the plan as exceeds the sum incurred for benefit payments, administrative expenses, premium and other taxes, and other retention charges. Contributions may be increased or decreased according to a Board approved reserve policy during the annual rate development process.

### Proposed Amendment to CCR 599.508, subdivision (a)(10)

(40) (9) Provide that in the event an employee or annuitant is dissatisfied with the amount paid or service rendered pursuant to his or her claim on his or her behalf or on behalf of a family member and so requests, representatives of the parties including a representative of the Board will confer in an effort to reach a settlement, provided that no agreement reached by such conferees shall bind the employee, annuitant, or carrier without each party's consent or bar any remedy otherwise available.

### ADDENDUM TO THE INITIAL STATEMENT OF REASONS

Proposed Amendment to amend Article 1 to Subchapter 3 of Chapter 2 of Division 1 of Title 2 of the California Code of Regulations (CCR)

Minimum Standards for Health Benefit Plans: Risk Adjustment

This Addendum to the Initial Statement of Reasons explains the purpose of the changes to the proposed regulations that are being made available after the 45-day comment period conducted from January 1, 2021 through February 15, 2021, and during the 15-day comment period conducted from August 19, 2021 to September 3, 2021.

#### **PURPOSE**

The initial proposed regulation changed a subset of procedures CalPERS utilizes to risk adjust health benefit plan premiums. Under current regulations, after CalPERS establishes a risk adjusted health benefit plan premium, it is required to use a back-end reconciliation process where health benefit plan premium dollars are transferred among health benefit plans to account for any changes in the health risk scores of individuals enrolled in the plans over a health benefit plan year. Government Code Section 22864 gives CalPERS the authority to risk adjust health benefit plan premiums. Government Code Section 22850 further requires that risk adjustment procedures implemented by the CalPERS Board must be based on rules and regulations adopted by the Board. The initial proposed regulation:

- Deleted the back-end premium reconciliation process;
- Amended the risk adjustment definition;
- Required the risk assessment method selected by CalPERS to be consistent with industry best practices;
- Deleted a requirement that CalPERS provide health benefit plans its risk adjustment methodology at least 90 days prior to the public announcement of the following year health benefit plan premiums.
- Permitted the CalPERS Board to exclude certain health benefit plans from having their premiums risk adjusted;
- Permitted the CalPERS Board to phase-in a risk adjustment calculation to all or specific health benefit plans over a period as determined by the Board; and
- Deleted an obsolete monetary reserve requirement for health benefit plans.

The revised proposed regulation makes the following changes:

- Deletes the requirement that the risk assessment method selected by CalPERS be
  consistent with industry best practices and reinserts the original regulatory language that
  the risk adjustment methodology selected by CalPERS be consistent with industry best
  practices and similar to risk adjustment methodologies used by the U.S. Department of
  Health and Human Services and other state and federal agencies.
- Reinserts the original regulatory language requiring CalPERS to provide health benefit
  plans its risk adjustment methodology at least 90 days prior to the public announcement
  of the following year health benefit plan premiums.
- Deletes the provision permitting the Board to exclude certain health benefit plans from having their premiums risk adjusted;

- Clarifies and adds criteria to the provision permitting the Board to phase-in a risk adjustment calculation to all or specific health benefit plans over a period as determined by the Board; and
- Specifies that risk adjustment does not apply to CalPERS Medicare health benefit plans.

### **CLARIFICATION**

When CalPERS initially proposed these regulatory amendments, it thought they were non-substantive, since existing law already permits the CalPERS Board to implement a risk adjustment program. These proposed changes do not impact CalPERS authority to risk adjust but they do, however, propose to amend regulatory requirements for the processes used for health benefit plan risk adjustment. For this reason, the proposed regulatory changes are substantive in nature.

### **NECESSITY**

Section 599.500, subdivision (x):

Amending this subdivision was necessary to update the definition of risk adjustment to reflect current actuarial science.

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8):

Amending this paragraph initially was necessary to change a requirement for a health benefits plan to participate in risk adjustment procedures as outlined in subparagraphs (A) - (E) and instead participate in a risk adjustment methodology approved by CalPERS. This change was necessary because a methodology provides CalPERS the ability to incorporate evolving industry best practices to assess health risk, whereas a procedure is static. As part of this addendum, the amendment to this paragraph is necessary since it would be more logical to add the criteria for selecting a risk adjustment methodology along with the requirement that health benefit plans must participate in the risk adjustment methodology approved by CalPERS.

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(A):

Amending this subparagraph initially was necessary to delete a requirement that CalPERS selected risk adjustment methodology must be similar to the one used by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services and other state and federal agencies. This subparagraph also deleted a notice requirement to health benefit plans. As part of this addendum, the amendment to this subparagraph is necessary because CalPERS has determined that the deleted criteria for selecting a risk adjustment methodology is essential but moved this requirement to paragraph (8). The term "risk assessment method" has been changed to "risk adjustment methodology" in paragraph (8) for consistency. CalPERS has also decided to retain the notice requirement to health benefit plans. CalPERS originally deleted this provision because health plans are notified of a risk adjustment methodology, which does not include a back-end premium reconciliation process, more than 90 days prior to the Board approving the following year's health benefit plan premiums. Upon further consideration, CalPERS thinks this requirement should be retained for clarity.

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(B):

Amending this subparagraph initially was necessary to delete part of the procedures requiring CalPERS to undergo a back-end reconciliation process to transfer premium dollars among health benefit plans to account for any changes in the health risk scores of individuals enrolled in the plans over a health benefit plan year. This is an outdated process that does not permit the

CalPERS Board to effectively mitigate health risk in setting CalPERS health benefit plan premiums. Furthermore, a new provision was added to this paragraph to permit the CalPERS Board to exclude certain health benefit plans from having their premiums risk adjusted. As part of this addendum, the amendment to this paragraph is necessary to delete the initially proposed language because CalPERS has determined that it will exclude only Medicare health benefit plans from risk adjustment because the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) risk adjusts these plans. This exclusion has been expressly stated in subparagraph (D). Therefore, the more general exclusion that was initially proposed is not necessary.

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(C):

Amending this subparagraph initially was necessary to delete part of the procedures requiring CalPERS to undergo a back-end reconciliation process to transfer premium dollars among health benefit plans to account for any changes in the health risk scores of individuals enrolled in the plans over a health benefit plan year. This is an outdated process that does not permit the CalPERS Board to effectively mitigate health risk in setting CalPERS health benefit plan premiums. Furthermore, a new provision was added to this paragraph to permit the CalPERS Board to phase-in a risk adjustment calculation to all or specific health benefit plans over a period as determined by the Board. As part of this addendum, the amendment to this paragraph is necessary to specify the number of years the CalPERS Board can phase-in health benefit plan premium adjustments when it implements a risk adjustment methodology. Three years was chosen to minimize the risk that potential future premium increases could be combined with a phase-in, which could create financial challenges for CalPERS members and their employers to absorb these increases. The amendment also specifies the circumstance under which the CalPERS Board can phase-in premium adjustments. CalPERS chose a ten percent premium increase or decrease in one individual plan as it aligns with a notice CalPERS currently provides to members when their health plan's premium will increase by ten percent or more for the following year. This subparagraph has been renumbered to subdivision (a)(8)(B).

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(D):

Amending this subparagraph initially was necessary to delete part of the procedures requiring CalPERS to undergo a back-end reconciliation process to transfer premium dollars among health benefit plans to account for any changes in the health risk scores of individuals enrolled in the plans over a health benefit plan year. This is an outdated process that does not permit the CalPERS Board to effectively mitigate health risk in setting CalPERS health benefit plan premiums. This deletion resulted in subparagraph (D) having no language and therefore necessitating the language in subparagraph (E) to be moved to subparagraph (D). As part of this addendum, the amendment to this paragraph is necessary to exclude Medicare health benefit plans from risk adjustment because the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) risk adjusts these plans. This subparagraph has been renumbered to subdivision (a)(8)(C).

### Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(8)(E):

Deleting this subparagraph was necessary for re-lettering accuracy. This subparagraph's existing language stating that the provisions of this paragraph do not apply to CalPERS Board-approved employee association health benefit plans has been moved to subdivision (a)(8)(C).

Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(9):

Deleting this paragraph was necessary to remove a monetary reserve requirement for CalPERS health benefit plans. This requirement was adopted in 1975. Since then, the regulatory requirements for health benefit plans reserves is more extensive than this provision. Therefore, this provision is obsolete.

Section 599.508, subdivision (a)(10): Deleting this subparagraph was necessary for re-lettering accuracy.

## RURAL FIRE CAPACITY PROGRAM TERMS AND CONDITIONS

### DEPARTMENT OF FORESTRY AND FIRE PROTECTION

### STATE OF CALIFORNIA Natural Resources Agency

Agreement for the Rural Fire Capacity Program of the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act of 1978

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered between the STATE of California, acting through the Director of the Department of Forestry and Fire Protection hereinafter called "STATE", and hereinafter called "LOCAL AGENCY", covenants as follows:

#### RECITALS:

- STATE has been approved as a passthrough agent of the United States Department of Agriculture, (USDA), Forest Service for the purpose of administering the Rural Fire Capacity program in California, hereinafter referred to as RFC, authorized by the Cooperative Forestry Assistance Act (CFAA) of 1978 (PL 95-313, 92 Stat 365, 16 U.S.C. 2101-2114), as amended.
- 2. This is a subaward under the 2021 Rural Fire Capacity Grant #21-DG-11052012-138 awarded to STATE by the Forest Service on July 21,2021. The CFDA for the award is 10.664, Cooperative Forestry Assistance. This subaward is funded solely with Federal funds and is subject to the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) guidance in subparts A through F of 2 CFR Part 200, as adopted and supplemented by the USDA in 2 CFR Part 400, and under certain terms and conditions to LOCAL AGENCY to assist LOCAL AGENCY to upgrade its fire protection capability.
- 3. LOCAL AGENCY desires to participate in said RFC and agrees to the terms and conditions specified in the Procedural Guide for Rural Fire Capacity Program 2021.

NOW THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the parties as follows:

- 4. <u>APPROVAL</u>: This Agreement is of no force or effect until signed by both parties and approved by the Department of General Services, if required. LOCAL AGENCY may not commence performance until such approval has been obtained.
- 5. <u>INCORPORATION</u>: The Procedural Guide for Rural Fire Capacity Program 2021, submitted Application for Funding and associated Grant Assurances are hereby incorporated by reference as part of the Grant Agreement.
- 6. <u>TIMELINESS</u>: Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 7. <u>FORFEITURE OF AWARD</u>: LOCAL AGENCY must return this Agreement and required resolution properly signed and executed to STATE at the email address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than December 1, 2021 or LOCAL AGENCY will forfeit the funds.

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8. GRANT AND BUDGET CONTIGENCY CLAUSE: It is mutually understood between the parties that this **Agreement** may have been written for the mutual benefit of both parties before ascertaining the availability of congressional appropriation of funds, to avoid program and fiscal delays that would occur if the **Agreement** were executed after that determination was made.

This **Agreement** is valid and enforceable only if sufficient funds are made available to the STATE by the United States Government for the **State Fiscal Year 2021** for the purpose of this program. In addition, this **Agreement** is subject to any additional restrictions, limitations, or conditions enacted by the Congress or to any statute enacted by the Congress that may affect the provisions, terms, or funding of this **Agreement** in any manner.

The parties mutually agree that if the Congress does not appropriate sufficient funds for the program, this **Agreement** shall be amended to reflect any reduction in funds.

The STATE has the option to invalidate the **Agreement** under the 30-day cancellation clause or to amend the **Agreement** to reflect any reduction in funds.

- 9. REIMBURSEMENT: STATE will reimburse LOCAL AGENCY, from funds made available to STATE by the Federal Government, an amount not to exceed \$19,740.00 on a 50/50 matching funds basis, for the performance of specific projects and/or purchase of specific items identified in Proposed Project, Application for Funding, attached hereto. Reimbursement will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between THE LAST SIGNATORY DATE ON PAGE 1 and JUNE 30, 2022. This sum is the sole and maximum payment that STATE will make pursuant to this Agreement. LOCAL AGENCY must bill STATE at the e-mail address specified in paragraph 12, with a timestamp no later than September 1, 2022 in order to receive the funds. The bill submitted by LOCAL AGENCY must clearly delineate the projects performed and/or items purchased. A vendor's invoice and proof of payment to vendor(s) must be included for items purchased.
- 10. <u>LIMITATIONS</u>: Expenditure of the funds distributed by STATE herein is subject to the same limitations as placed by the RFC, upon expenditure of United States Government Funds. Pursuant to 2CFR200.313 Equipment, subject to the obligations and conditions set forth in that section; title to any equipment and supplies acquired under this **Agreement** vests with the LOCAL AGENCY. For any equipment items over \$5,000, the federal government may retain a vested interested in accordance with paragraph 16 below.
- 11. MATCHING FUNDS: Any and all funds paid to LOCAL AGENCY under the terms of this Agreement, hereinafter referred to as "RFC Funds", shall be matched by LOCAL AGENCY on a dollar-for-dollar basis, for each project listed on attachment(s) hereto identified as "Proposed Project". No amount of unpaid "contributed" or "volunteer" labor or services shall be used or consigned in calculating the matching amount "actually spent" by LOCAL AGENCY.

LOCAL AGENCY shall not use RFC Funds as matching funds for other federal grants, including Department of Interior (USDI) Rural Fire Assistance grants, nor use funds from other federal grants, including USDI Rural Fire Assistance grants, as matching funds for RFC Funds.

- 13. <u>PURPOSE</u>: Any project to be funded hereunder must be intended to specifically assist LOCAL AGENCY to organize, train, and/or equip local firefighting forces in the aforementioned rural area and community to prevent or suppress fires which threaten life, resources, and/or improvements within the area of operation of LOCAL AGENCY. Project funds are not to be used for research and development.
- 14. <u>COMBINING</u>: In the event funds are paid for two or more separate, but closely related projects, the 50/50 cost-sharing formula will be applied to the total cost of such combined projects.
- 15. OVERRUNS: In the event that the total cost of a funded project exceeds the estimate of costs upon which this Agreement is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request additional funds to cover the **Agreement** share of the amount exceeded. However, there is no assurance that any such funds are, or may be, available for reimbursement. Any increase in funding will require an amendment.
- 16. <u>UNDERRUNS</u>: In the event that the total cost of a funded project is less than the estimate of costs upon which this **Agreement** is made, LOCAL AGENCY may request that additional eligible projects/items be approved by STATE for **Agreement** funding. However, there is no assurance that any such approval will be funded. Approval of additional projects/items, not listed on the Proposed Project application, made by STATE, will be in writing and will require an amendment.
- 17. FEDERAL INTEREST IN EQUIPMENT: The Federal Government has a vested interest in any item purchased with RFC funding in excess of \$5,000 regardless of the length of this Agreement, until such time as the fair market value is less than \$5,000. The RFC percentage used to purchase the equipment will be applied to the sale price and recovered for the Government during the sale. This percentage will remain the same even following depreciation. The Federal Government may not have to be reimbursed if the disposal sale amounts to a fair market value of less than \$5,000. LOCAL AGENCY will notify STATE of the disposal of such items.

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18. <u>EQUIPMENT INVENTORY</u>: Any single item purchased in excess of \$5,000 will be assigned an RFC Property Number by the STATE. LOCAL AGENCY shall forward a copy of the purchase documents listing the item, brand, model, serial number, any LOCAL AGENCY property number assigned, and a LOCAL AGENCY contact and return address to STATE at the address specified in paragraph 12. The STATE will advise the LOCAL AGENCY Contact of the RFC Property Number assigned.

- 19. <u>AUDIT</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees that the STATE, the Department of General Services, the Bureau of State Audits, or their designated representative shall have the right to review and to copy any records and supporting documentation pertaining to the performance of this **Agreement**. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to maintain such records for possible audit for a minimum of five (5) years after final payment, unless a longer period of records retention is stipulated. LOCAL AGENCY agrees to allow the auditor(s) access to such records during normal business hours and to allow interviews of any employees who might reasonably have information related to such records. Further, LOCAL AGENCY agrees to include a similar right of the State of California to audit records and interview staff in any subcontract related to performance of this **Agreement**. (GC 8546.7, PCC 10115 et seq., CCR Title 2, Section 1896).

- 21. <u>MONITORING</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to the monitoring of activities as necessary by STATE to ensure that the award is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with Federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the agreement; and that performance goals are achieved.
- 22. <u>INDEMNIFICATION</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless, the STATE, its officers, agents, and employees, from any and all claims and losses, accruing or resulting to any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers, and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials, or supplies in connection with the performance of this **Agreement**, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by LOCAL AGENCY in the performance of this **Agreement**.
- 23. <u>CIVIL RIGHTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY agrees to comply with civil rights requirements as detailed in the Complying With Civil Rights Requirements brochure (FS-850) and the And Justice For All poster (AD-475A). The poster is to be placed at all public point of contact/reception areas.
- 24. <u>DRUG-FREE WORKPLACE REQUIREMENTS</u>: LOCAL AGENCY will comply with the requirements of the Drug-Free Workplace Act of 1990 and will provide a drug-free workplace by taking the following actions:
  - a. Publish a statement notifying employees that unlawful manufacture, distribution, dispensation, possession or use of a controlled substance is prohibited and specifying actions to be taken against employees for violations.
  - b. Establish a Drug-Free Awareness Program to inform employees about:

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- 1) the dangers of drug abuse in the workplace;
- 2) the person's or organization's policy of maintaining a drugfree workplace;
- any available counseling, rehabilitation and employee assistance programs; and,

- 26. <u>TERMINATION</u>: This **Agreement** may be terminated by either party giving 30 days written notice to the other party or provisions herein amended upon mutual consent of the parties hereto.
- 27. <u>AMENDMENTS</u>: No amendment or variation of the terms of this **Agreement** shall be valid unless made in writing, signed by the parties and approved as required. No oral understanding or **Agreement** not incorporated in the **Agreement** is binding on any of the parties.
- 28. <u>INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR</u>: LOCAL AGENCY, and the agents and employees of LOCAL AGENCY, in the performance of this **Agreement**, shall act in an independent capacity and not as officers or employees or agents of the STATE or the Federal Government.
- 29. <u>INDIRECT RATE</u>: LOCAL AGENCY may not assess an indirect rate in excess of their Federally approved Negotiated Indirect Cost Rate Agreement (NICRA), a de minimis rate if LOCAL AGENCY does not have an approved NICRA, or the RFC program cap rate of 10%, whichever is lesser. LOCAL AGENCY may also elect not to assess an indirect rate. The approved indirect cost rate at the time of execution is 0%.
- 30. <u>MEDIA</u>: LOCAL AGENCY shall acknowledge STATE and USDA Forest Service support in any publications, audiovisuals and electronic media developed as a result of this award.

It is encouraged to give public notice of the receipt of this award and announce progress and accomplishments, acknowledging STATE and USDA Forest Service support. Follow direction in USDA Supplemental 2 CFR 415.2.

31. <u>ASSIGNMENT</u>: This Agreement is not assignable by LOCAL AGENCY either in whole or in part.



Ebbetts Pass Fire District (EPFD) is a combination fire district that serves several rural communities in southeastern Calaveras County. EPFD has 25 paid FFs and 11 volunter FFs that staff 4 stations. EPFD provides 24/7 ALS Engine and Ambulance service to our response area and surrounding districts through mutual aid. EPFD is an all-hazard agency that also provides ALS transport. While we serve several small rural communities surrounding Arnold, we experience population surges during peak tourist seasons. These surges can temporarily triple our popupulation served. Our rural water systems make water supply on fires challenging. Most subdivisions have hydrants or standpipes, but not all homes are within 1000' of a water supply, forcing our apparatus to carry an expanded water supply.

EPFD is asking for funding to begin replacing 12 out of 40 sets of structural PPE. This PPE is 10yoa, no longer certifiable for use in IDLH environments, and no longer NFPA 1971 compliant. These sets of turnouts have substantial damage to them from years of use and are no longer repairable. This PPE is vital to emergency/non-emergency district operations and protecting our FFs and citizens. Without it, we will not be able to provide the level of service our communities deserve and pay for.

In addition to the original request(s), Applicants may list alternative projects for excess or unused funds, which the State will review during the initial application process. The State will determine which of the Applicant's projects are eligible for funding if excess or unused funds become available. Upon advance written approval by the State, the applicant may use additional/excess funding up to the contract maximum amount to purchase State approved items in listed order of priority on their application.

Deviations from the original application are considered an amendment and require prior approval before the amended expenditures can be made.

The funds will be only for those projects accomplished and/or items purchased between Agreement Approval Date and June 30, 2022. I reviewed the Calendar Year 2021 Intergovernmental Agreement and there are no substantive changes to the agreement language. Please review the updated contact and signatory information for Ebbetts Pass on pages 4 and 6 of the attached updated DHCS Agreement on Monday and confirm that it is correct. I will send the Agreement back to DHCS for finalization. And note that you do not need to sign the Agreement at this time

While there are no substantive changes in the Agreement language, note that the estimated contributions that DHCS has approved in the CY 2021 Intergovernmental Agreement are a bit lower than what was originally submitted in your Letters of Interest:

As DHCS noted in their email, they revised "the available rate range funding calculation to reflect updated member month estimates, federal financial participation percentages, and capitation rates." My guess is that DHCS may have previously overestimated Medi-Cal enrollment due to COVID and has since adjusted those estimates, which in turn lowered the overall IGT contributions for the Governmental Entities. This was something that we saw happen in the 2019-20 IGT reconciliation – the actual number of Medi-Cal member months was lower than what they had estimated for the 2019-20 IGT period, which decreased contributions and payments.



o1. The Board of Directors of the Ebbetts Pass Fire Protection District hereby authorizes the establishment of an Auxiliary as a formal organization for purposes as outlined within an adopted set of bylaws, and will function with permission of the Board under the rules and regulations outlined within its bylaws, this policy.

o2. The Board may purchase accident, sickness, disability, life, or other such insurance forshall provide workers compensation for members of the Auxiliary who may be injured in the line of duty while working for the District.

o3. The Auxiliary program shall be coordinated through a designated shift captain, but members are expected to work directly with various supervisors of EPFD or with executive members of the Ebbetts Pass Firefighters Association on specific incidents, events, projects, and special support function needs.

04. Auxiliary Members serve in a volunteer capacity.

<u>05. Auxiliary Members shall not be used in capacity of an emergency responder under any circumstances.</u>

o6. Auxiliary Members shall complete an EPFD Volunteer Application, DMV Physical, and Live Scan prior to acceptance.

<u>07. Auxiliary members are expected to participate in non-emergency situations such as logistical needs of the District. Many logistical tasks require driving utilities at minimum; therefore completion of the driving task book for utility vehicles is highly recommended for all Auxiliary members.</u>

08. It is the intent of the Fire District to utilize Auxiliary Members in the following, but not limited to:

- Shuttling out-of-service vehicles to repair facilities (Class B Vehicles require Class <u>C License with an F- Endorsement at a minimum and required to have a valid</u> DMV Physical every 2 years on file with the District)
- Assist with crew shuttle during wildland fire season
- Delivering supplies to an incident such as water, food, board-up supplies, and equipment if there is no immediate hazard to life involved to the Auxiliary Member
- Support large scale incidents / events; Structure fires, vegetation fires, technical rescue, training exercises, and large scale events
- Assist in the EPFD District Operational Center during large events such as winter storms.

- Communications work: Radio operator, human repeater, radio programing, public information under the direction of the District PIO, or radio repeater maintenance.
- Support training evolutions
- Ebbetts Pass Firefighters Association: Participate in various EPFFA events through-out the year such as Alisa Ann Ruch Foundation, Independence Day Parade, annual raffle mailer stuffing and Independence Day BBQ. All Auxiliary Members shall be encouraged to be an EPFFA Member
- Assist with events: Dorrington Santa and Blue Lake Springs Touch-A Truck events for example

09. An auxiliary uniform shirt to be used during official District business

10. Participation in a minimum of 2 events annually required to maintain affiliation as an Auxiliary Member in good standing. District and Association events qualify equally.
